Capital Campaign to Benefit Club Capital Improvements

Recently, a long-time member sent a generous donation in the amount of \$1000.00 to be used for the Club and/or Council Charities. At a recent officers' meeting, the generosity of this member inspired the Officers to recommend that the donation be used to kick off a capital campaign to help refurbish our Council Home. As many of you know, the Council Chambers is in need of refurbished flooring and refreshed paint, the kitchen floor is original from the early 1960's, and our parking lot is crumbling — just to name a few of the things that need attention.

The Knights are the ONLY remaining civic organization with a clubhouse that has neither folded nor abandoned Hillside. Our hope is to continue serving the community for many more years. While many of our members no longer live locally, most of our members had roots in Hillside, so we seek the support of all members in this effort. As we approach the 75th anniversary of our Council in 2024, having a presentable hall is essential for hosting the many community and charitable events that are hosted in our facilities.

The Council and Columbian Club Officers have targeted a goal of \$20,000.00 for this capital campaign. In addition to the aforementioned donation, we already have a pledge of another \$1000.00 donation, so we immediately at 10% of the goal! Funds will be held by the Council in a segregated sub-account in the Council treasury and will be overseen by the Council financial officers and trustees until the Club repairs are made.

We invite all members (and other supporters) to help this effort. Please consider a donation in your name, or memorial donation to remember a departed loved one. As we have in similar efforts in the past, a plaque will be installed in the Club to commemorate the generosity of the donors. The plaque will commemorate donors at the following levels:
